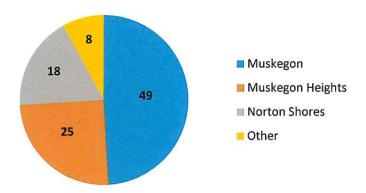
5 Year (2021-2025) Regional Consolidated Plan (RCP)

Every 3-5 Years, the City must devise a Consolidated Plan that identifies priorities and objectives for addressing the community's needs over the next planning period and the implementation of its Strategic Plan. As a part of this process, the City conducted a county-wide survey amongst residents, stakeholders, social service-oriented agencies, public housing, businesses neighboring municipalities, staff and coworkers.

The survey focused on the following areas: Community Services, Housing, and Public Service's Needs with the dual purpose of identifying gaps in programs/services as well as aid in establishing priorities according to need.

Amongst those surveyed, approximately **49%** were residents of the City of Muskegon, followed by **25%**, City of Muskegon Heights, **18%** City of Norton Shores with the remaining **8%** being categorized as other, but yet residents of Muskegon County.



In ranking the highest level of needs according to focus area, the Survey results are as follows:

Survey Top 5 Ranking

- 1. Neighborhood Enhancement Programs;
- 2. Home Repair Assistance and Housing Programs;
- 3. Youth Initiatives and Recreation Programs;
- 4. Crime Prevention Programs; and,
- 5. Economic/Job Development Programs.

47th Program Year/2021 Annual Action Plan (AAP)

The City receives an Annual Allocation from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to administer its Community Development Block (CDBG) Programs. The City's CDBG Allocation for implementing the first

2021 Environmental Review Record (ERR)

The 2021 Environmental Review Record (ERR) is required by HUD for clearance of funds, once plan(s) have been approved. In order to clear funds, the City must submit documentation to HUD which identifies and categorize each project, pursuant 24 CFR 58.34(a) and 58.35(b).

Projects that are EXEMPT from this process include: General/Rehab Administration, Code Enforcement (Inspections and Smoke Detectors), Fair Housing, and Homebuyer Assistance/Education Programs. Projects that are CATEGORICALLY EXCLUDED, meaning require clearance, prior to spending include: Moderate/Priority Rehabilitation, Exterior Paint/Siding, Demolition, ADR, Code Enforcement (Neighborhood Clean-Up), Public Facilities Improvements and Improved Neighborhoods Programs. The ERR will be made available for review, during its 15-Day Public Comment Period, commencing on or about May 15, 2021. Although a public hearing is not required for the submission of the ERR, the City will accept any comments during its "ZOOM" Public Hearing which has been scheduled on May 13, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. For "ZOOM" link and more information, see Citizen Participation section below.

Citizen Participation

In accordance with Federal Regulations, 24 CFR Part 91, the City has prepared a Draft of its 5 Year (2021-2025) Regional Consolidated Plan and its Proposed 47th Year (2021) Annual Action Plan. Both planning documents reflect the needs, priorities, resources and activities to be implemented utilizing U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds. The City's HUD Allocation for the 47th Program Year (2021) Annual Action Plan and carryout of its CDBG Programs is \$440,007.

The Draft 5 Year (2021-2025) Regional Consolidated Plan and the Proposed 47th Year (2021) Annual Action Plan will be made available during its 30-Day Public Comment Period (04/16/21 – 05/16/21) via the City's website at www.cityofmuskegonheights.org, by mail or email request. A "ZOOM" Public Hearing will be held on the 2021-2025 RCP; the 2021 AAP and ERR on 05/13/21 at 5:30 p.m. The Public Hearing "ZOOM" link is as follows:
